Happy Holidays! Yep, the year is almost over – and, what a year it was! Thanks to your donations, we exceeded our goal to spay/neuter at least 2,007 animals this year. As this newsletter goes to print, **2,319** have been altered. Our adoption program has successfully placed **29** dogs and **349** cats in new homes so far this year. I will inform you about the final 2007 numbers for spay/neuter and adoptions in our spring newsletter.

Let me tell you, the last newsletter was a real hit with some of our members! The story about the one-eyed kitty that found a loving home and the other reports on the volunteer and rescue work that is going on within CPA made an impression. Of course, I wonder from newsletter to newsletter what I could write about (besides Charlie Chow). Well, wouldn't you know, something unusual happened to Carel Ahlefeld, our Treasurer and all-round person. She received a phone call from paramedics who were attempting to transport a patient to the hospital. The man didn't want to leave unless he was assured someone would take care of his cat. The paramedics asked Carel if she would be able to look after the gentleman's cat. This is not the kind of call CPA normally gets. Well, Carel went to the man's residence and took care of providing the cat with food and water (there was none). The man is now back home and capable of caring for his kitty. Days in our lives...

MEET THE BOARD

I'm Melissa Mehring and I became one of the newest CPA Board members after accepting responsibility for Animal Issues.

I joined CPA in May 2007 after investigating a few other animal rescue organizations. CPA needed volunteers to walk the dogs they have available for adoption at All Pet Headquarters. I walked dogs and cared for cats at the store for several weeks, then gradually started volunteering to help out at street fairs, pick up food donations, take sick animals to vet appointments, and before I knew it I was fostering sick (but still adorable and amusing) kittens. It was the thick of kitten season and every time one of my fosters was healthy enough for adoption, there was another kitten with upper respiratory infection that required twice daily medicines and humidifier therapy.

Eventually I got my brood down to two kittens – Oscar, who had pneumonia and a collapsed lung, and Cora, who was terrified of people as a result of abuse and had been so infested with fleas that she was anemic. While all the fosters melted my heart, these two really grew on me and so they became permanent members of my family in October.

In addition to the hands-on animal care, I also wanted to lend some of my other skills to CPA. I began photographing our adoptable pets and posting them on Petfinder.com so they can be seen by more potential adoptive homes. Then I offered, with the help of my fiancé, to undertake revising and maintaining CPA's web site. The updated site is now live at:

www.concernedpeopleforanimals.org and we're continuing to add new content. I have also relieved Ami Gibson (CPA Idaho Division) of the responsibility for our newsletter. (Don't worry, she was really ready to pass it on!)

In 2008, I will continue developing the web site to support CPA's goal of improving and protecting the lives of cats, dogs, and other animals through education, action, and fellowship. The site will be updated to make it easier to order CPA's products and make donations online. And we will add resources to educate people about topics of particular concern to CPA (e.g., declawing, feral cats, and indoor/outdoor cats.)

I am proud to be a part of CPA and very thankful for all the members that make it possible to continue this important work on behalf of our communities' animal population.

SHOTZIE, Part 2

I brought Shotzie home that day knowing almost nothing about her. The only information given to me was that she was two years old, her hips were not dysplastic and she was a police dog reject – she failed the tests to bite. I can't tell you exactly what I knew other than that it was simply years of experience that added up to a feeling.

After paying a lot of money for an untrained dog that had no history, I put her on a leash and took her to my car. I opened the hatch and she flew into the crate. Nice. Now I knew she was crate trained and comfortable in a car. We rode home quietly. No whining. No restlessness. So far so good. We hung out for a few days before training began just to get settled in and build a trust. She loved to play ball, inhaled her food, and never guarded a bone. She was careful yet courageous and loved all the other dogs in my home – male or female, big or small. I noticed a kindness and serenity that I haven't seen in many dogs I have trained. I could even trust her with my two pound Chihuahua.

I began to fall in love with her. The celebrity I bought her for claimed to be excited about her. But he called only once during her two months of training and never visited her. He never knew what she looked like until I delivered her to him at the end. I began to regret that he would be her owner. She was one in a million and deserved someone who would adore her. But this wasn't my dog and it wasn't my place to judge. He was a self proclaimed dog lover, had a beautiful home, two other friendly dogs, and a fulltime staff. She would be well taken care of. Or so I thought.

The day I delivered Shotzie to her new celebrity owner, I left with tears in my eyes. He refused to put her on a leash and told me that she should just know what to do because she had been trained professionally. He patted her head with a detachment I haven't ever seen and said she would be fine. I told him he needed to work with me so I could teach him how to be her leader. He refused. He didn't want a crate and insisted she be given full run of his mansion. This had to be a disaster. You just can't take any dog, even with years of training, and throw him into a new house without showing him the ropes. It's like dropping off a three year old in Disneyland without supervision.

So I planted a seed. I told him that if he wanted to return her I would happily buy her back. All money would be refunded. No questions asked. And then I prayed. I prayed for her to be loved and have a wonderful home. And I prayed that she would be returned to me if she wasn't happy.

Three months later I received a phone call. Would I really give all the money back? Shotzie had begun to act out. She was having accidents in the house and becoming destructive. She was anxious and unhappy. None of this behavior ever happened in my home.

I took her back as soon as his secretary called me. I can't begin to tell you how incredibly grateful I am that Shotzie is now part of my life. She is truly perfect. She's a great watchdog, friendly with children and strangers, wonderful with every dog, flawless in the house, in a car, in a crowd, loves to play, is calm and loving. The list is endless.

It's all about luck, patience, and timing. Life mysteriously delivers what we need when we need it. It's all good!

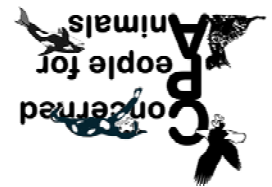
